Wellbeing



HSC CHEMISTRY DAY

Last Monday, February 12th, the Year 12 Chemistry class travelled to the Wagga Wagga Campus of Charles Sturt University, where they gained valuable experience in experimental technique. The students participated in various practical activities, which included work with acids and bases, using an Atomic Absorption Spectrometer to analyse the concentration of iron in Nutri-Grain cereal, and the oxidation of a jelly baby lolly known as the "Screaming Jelly Baby" reaction.

The students also gained valuable insight into the training, career and area of chemistry of several scientists working at the university.


