Homework Centre



Education on Wearing seatbelts on buses

Dear Parent,

More than 350,000 students across rural and regional NSW travel on school buses each day, covering more than 50 million kilometres each year.

On the 26th June 2017 the NSW Government announced a program to install seatbelts on all rural and regional buses. This program expands and accelerates the recommendation of the NSW School Bus Safety Community Advisory Committee, on which parents, schools and key stakeholders were represented. The Seat Belt Program now involves both replacing older buses with new buses fitted with seatbelts, as well as retrofitting seatbelts to buses.

While bus operators and drivers can remind passengers of the need to wear seatbelts (via signs, etc) it is the legal responsibility of passengers, including students, to wear the seatbelt provided. This letter is to ask parents and carers to please remind their children of the importance of wearing seatbelts when they are fitted to the child's school bus. Bus drivers are obviously not permitted to physically secure a seat belt for a student. Instead, they have been instructed to deal with any refusal by a student to fasten their seatbelt under TfNSW's Guidelines for Managing School Student Behaviour on Buses. Under these Guidelines the failure by a student to wear a seat belt is classified as "Unacceptable Behaviour" and is subject to penalties, including the suspension of travel on the bus, for repeat behaviour. With the recent commencement of school for 2018, we are asking parents and carers to remind their children of the importance to secure their seatbelt on the school bus (where provided). This will help reinforce in children's minds the need to wear their seatbelts securely each day and will ensure maximum safety for children on the daily commute to and from school.

We trust that you will assist in this important safety initiative.



Tax File Numbers

Any student will need at tax file number if he/she <u>starts work</u> (part-time and full-time) and all students planning on a tertiary education require one when they start. Students must now apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a participating Australia Post office.
