This term will again be a very busy one starting with our Year 12 students who will commence their Higher School Certificate examinations on Tuesday 20^{th} October. I would like to offer our best wishes to Year 12 for their HSC examinations.

HSC examination information and protocols for Year 12

If you have a known illness, like hay fever, that has similar symptoms to the flu:

- Get a medical certificate from your doctor.
- Give your school a copy of the certificate.

Exam day protocols

- For entry to the exam room, you will be asked to confirm that you do not have any flu-like symptoms and are not required by NSW Health to self-isolate.
- If you develop flu-like symptoms during an exam, let an exam supervisor know and follow their instructions.

You must:

- Regularly wash your hands.
- Cough and sneeze into the crook of your elbow.
- Avoid touching your face.
 - You may also choose to wear a mask.

Exam rooms will be thoroughly and frequently cleaned. Hygiene supplies will be available and regularly re-stocked.

Do NOT attend the exam(s) if you have:

- flu-like <u>symptoms</u> (fever, cough, sore/scratchy throat, shortness of breath, loss of taste or sense of smell)
- been tested for COVID-19 and have not yet received your test result
- been directed by NSW health to self-isolate
- you tested <u>positive for COVID-19</u>.
- Do not return until you have a negative result.
- Provide your school with medical evidence. Use a telehealth service if you cannot see a doctor in person. An SMS COVID-19 test result on its own is not sufficient evidence.
- Your school will provide an <u>illness/misadventure application</u> for you to complete and sign.
- Once completed and signed, the school will submit your application to NESA.

At the time of a written exam...If you have <u>flu-like symptoms</u>:

- Do not attend the exam.
- Contact your school as soon as possible to tell them.
- Get <u>tested</u> say you are an HSC student to get your results <u>fast tracked</u>.
- Do not return until you have a negative result.
- Provide your school with medical evidence. Use a telehealth service if you cannot see a doctor in person. An SMS COVID-19 test result on its own is not sufficient evidence.
- Your school will provide an <u>illness/misadventure application</u> for you to complete and sign.
- Once completed and signed, the school will submit your application to NESA.

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If you have tested positive to COVID-19:

- Do not attend the exam.
- Contact your school as soon as possible to tell them.
- Follow advice from your school and do not return until you have a negative result.
- Your school will provide an <u>illness/misadventure application</u> for you to complete and sign.
- Provide your school with a medical evidence. Use a telehealth service if you cannot see a doctor in person. An SMS COVID-19 test result on its own is not sufficient evidence.
- Once completed and signed, the school will submit your application to NESA.

If you are under the direction of NSW Health to self-isolate:

- Do not attend the exam.
- Contact your school as soon as possible to tell them.
- Your school will provide an <u>illness/misadventure application</u> for you to complete and sign.
- Provide your school with evidence.
- Once completed and signed, the school will submit your application to NESA.

What if I hear my school is closed due to a COVID-19 case?

- Only follow instructions from NSW Health or your school.
- If you are not directed to self-isolate, your school will advise you:
- to attend your exam at the scheduled venue as it has been cleared to operate by NSW Health
- to attend your exam at an alternative venue
- that your exam has been cancelled. Written exams will not be held online or rescheduled. If your exam is cancelled, your school will lodge an application for illness and misadventure on behalf of affected students.

Gardening at Leeton High School

Years 7-10 Yearly Examinations

Year 10 yearly examinations commence this week. Students in Years 7-9 will commence their yearly examinations from 2^{nd} - 13^{th} November.

Year 8 VALID assessment

Validation of Assessment for Learning & Individual Development (VALID) test for Year 8 students will be held on Thursday 29th October 2020. The test takes approximately 70 minutes. The VALID Science 8 test is an interactive, multimedia test completed entirely on a computer. VALID Science 8 contains multiple choice, short response and extended response tasks that are grouped around real-world issues, including scientific investigations. This is a diagnostic test, with tasks framed on Stage 4 outcomes and essential content in the NSW Science Years K–10 Syllabus.

Students will be tested on their:

- knowledge and understanding of science
- understanding and skills in the process of scientific investigation
- ability to evaluate evidence, make judgements and think critically
- ability to access information and communicate scientific ideas.

Students also complete a survey about their opinions, attitudes and values about science. Since students complete VALID Science 8 on a computer, each student needs to bring headphones or earbuds that plug into a school computer. Earbuds for an iPod or portable player are suitable. Results of the test will be available during Term 1 2021. Information about each student is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that the right to privacy of all students is maintained. A personalised electronic report describing the knowledge and skills demonstrated by students will be made available when ready.

Year 6 into 7 Transition Program

Despite the challenges of this year we have managed to link remotely with our partner primary schools to get to know our newest students and to share all the great things that happen at Leeton High School with them. With the easing of restriction this term we are now able to invite Year 6 students to visit us onsite. 

Year 6 into 7 2021 Transition


