HSC Minimum Standards Testing – Reading, Writing and Numeracy

To qualify for a Higher School Certificate, students need to meet a minimum standard (Level 3 - Australian Core Skills Framework) in three areas: Reading, Writing and Numeracy. This is to ensure that students have functional reading, writing and numeracy skills for tasks such as following safety instructions in equipment manuals, understanding a mobile phone plan, writing a job application and creating a personal weekly budget.







Students in Year 10 will shortly undertake a practice test in Reading, Writing and Numeracy in preparation for the actual test this term. Testing will be undertaken in English and Mathematics classes over the next three weeks.

Year 10 and 11 students will have four opportunities this year to reach the Level 3 benchmark. Students in Year 12 will have six opportunities to meet that standard in whatever area still required (Reading and/or Writing and/or Numeracy).

There are three separate 45 minute online tests:

- Reading Test 45 multiple choice questions
- Numeracy Test 45 multiple choice questions
- Writing Test one question based on a prompt

Please be aware that students will be able to sit their Higher School Certificate examinations and receive their results regardless of whether they have met the HSC minimum standard or not. Students are still eligible for an ATAR without meeting the Level 3 benchmarks. Students who have not met the minimum standard when their HSC results are issued still have opportunities to meet the standard and receive the HSC credential for up to two years after they finish their HSC examinations through the school by negotiation. For the students who don't meet the minimum standard upon leaving or within this testing timeframe, a Record of School Achievement (RoSA) will be awarded.

It is very important that students take this opportunity to meet the Level 3 standard seriously and apply themselves to the testing as it provides greater options and acts as recognition of having achieved the award of the Higher School Certificate and demonstrates the desired level of literacy and numeracy to employers if they choose this pathway. 
