Welcome back to Week 10 Term 3!

Welcome back to face to face learning! All students and staff return to Leeton High School from Monday 13th September for the last week of Term 3 (Week B timetable). It has been a challenging four weeks with remote learning, however students have done remarkably well adapting to the learning from home environment. Thank you to our parents and families for their efforts and patience during this time, many of which would have had to juggle their own work commitments while supporting

their children to learn from home. Thank you to our teachers who have again risen to the challenge of delivering learning online and accommodating students requiring learning from home hard copies. Our Wellbeing staff have also been fantastic in keeping our spirits up with various activities and publications including running a 'wear it yellow' R U Okay? Day and themed selfie days which has certainly put some smiles on faces. Thank you to our Learning and Support staff for running drop-in Zoom meetings every day from 9am-3pm to support students with their learning and to our office and wellbeing staff who have put together and delivered all the





learning from home packs for students who require hard copies.

Thankfully, we can now return to school for the last week of term. We have missed our students and look forward to seeing them onsite from Monday.

We return to school under Level 3 settings. This is a full return for all cohorts to schools, with reduced mingling and on-site activities.

This includes the mandatory wearing of masks for all students and teachers indoors and outdoors. Staff and students required to wear masks may remove them when:

- they are eating or drinking
- engaging in strenuous physical exercise
- they are communicating with another person who is deaf or hard of hearing

Please note: Where a student chooses to continue not wearing a mask without a valid reason, they will be required to learn from home until a suitable resolution is established to return the student to school.

We have put additional measures in place to reduce the mingling of students outside their year or stage group, outside of the classroom, as per the guidelines and will maintain appropriate hygiene practices across the school to keep us safe and healthy. Please do not send students to school if they are unwell. Thank you for your support and understanding as we navigate this week at school under Level 3 restrictions. Year 11 Final Examinations

With the return to face to face learning on Monday students will continue to undertake their examinations online. On arrival on Monday morning, Year 11 students will be directed to their examination space to complete their examinations scheduled for Monday and the same for Tuesday. Again, I would like to thank Year 11 and their parents/carers for their patience and adaptability and I wish Year 11 all the best as they complete their examinations.

HSC Written Examinations Update

I can confirm that <u>HSC written exams</u> will start on **9 November** and end on **3 December** with results to be released from **6am on 24 January**. ATARs will be released on **20 January**.

110 exams will be run over 19 days, with exams ending three weeks after the previous timetable was due to finish. The examination timetable has been provided to all Year 12 students via email and their Year 12 Google Classroom. Students' personalised timetables will be available via Students Online from midday on **Monday 13 September.**

Strict <u>COVID safe protocols</u>, supported by NSW Health, will be in place to protect students, exam supervisors and school staff for all exams.

The protocols include:

- Mandatory face masks for students and staff, indoors and outdoors
- Check-in and health screening protocols for students and staff
- Physical distancing between students and staff at all times
- Minimising mingling of student groups
- Well ventilated exam rooms
- Keeping exam group sizes as small as possible
- Desks spaced a minimum of 1.5 metres apart
- Hygiene marshals and regular cleaning of exam rooms.

The <u>illness and misadventure process</u> is available for students who are unable to attend an exam due to having a positive COVID-19 test result, being a close contact or having COVID-19 symptoms. UAC UPDATE

IMPORTANT UPDATE FOR YEAR 12 STUDENTS APPLYING TO UNI 2022:

You can now claim financial hardship under the Educational Access Scheme (EAS) if your parent or guardian has received COVID-19 Disaster Payments for at least three months. This is in addition to the existing provisions for applicants whose parent or guardian has received JobKeeker or JobSeeker payments. We urge all eligible students to apply. Go to http://www.uac.edu.au for more information.

REVISED DATES:

There are no changes to the SRS (School Recommendation Scheme) timetable and offers will be released on November 12. Students have until the **19 September 2021 to apply.** The Schools Recommendation Scheme (SRS) is one way institutions make early offers of undergraduate admission to Year 12 students. They do this by using criteria other than (or in addition to) the ATAR.

Year 12 students will not receive ATAR-based offers in December, as in previous years. **The first ATAR-based offer round for Year 12 students will be January Round 2 on 26 January 2022.**

- ATARs released Thursday, 20 January 2022.
- **Change of preference deadline** midnight Friday, 21 January 2022.
- HSC results released Monday, 24 January 2022.
- Offers released Wednesday, 26 January 2022.

Changes to the UAC timetable will be available on the UAC website every soon.

Jan Cathcart Scholarship 2022



Applications are now open for the 2022 Scholarship.

The Scholarship program was launched in 2014 to honour the memory of long-term SunRice employee Jan Cathcart, and recognise her high principles, commitment and 43-year contribution to the rice industry, SunRice, and our shareholders and growers. It is designed to support women who demonstrate a passion for and commitment to the rice industry, and who can contribute to shaping its positive future.

The Scholarship is open to female shareholders, growers and employees, and their extended families. We encourage women from across our networks to apply, or to nominate other eligible women who would benefit from the program.

One applicant will be selected to receive a \$10,000 scholarship for each year of her tertiary study, for up to three years, to start in the first Semester of 2022. The successful applicant will be chosen on: her commitment to a career in agriculture or agribusiness; her involvement in work experience and community service; leadership potential; and academic achievements.

To be eligible for the Jan Cathcart Scholarship, an applicant's tertiary study will ideally be aligned to professional positions for which there is growing demand across regional Australia. These would include, but not be limited to, agricultural science, engineering and finance / business. Priority will be given to applicants from regional Australia, preferably those from rice growing areas, however we welcome all suitable applicants. The scholarship is open to both eligible students currently studying at university or new students attending their first year of university in 2022.
